Photography studies at SFCC include digital, silver, and non-silver techniques, as well as, conceptual and expressive approaches to using photography as a means of communication. Students develop an understanding of historical, cultural, and aesthetic perspectives in photography in addition to learning how to critically analyze an image. Students complete their general and core studies, as well as, create a portfolio of their work.

The AA degree is designed for students who intend to transfer to a four year college or university to complete a bachelor's degree. Students should select all associate level courses in consultation with an SFCC advisor. It is also recommended that students work closely with their transfer institution and their SFCC advisors to ensure the best transition to a four year school.
