An Associates Degree in Professional Crafts provides students with skills in one of the three disciplines of woodworking, ceramics, or jewelry. Entrepreneurial and design skills prepare the graduate for self-employment as a professional artisan. Students develop highly refined skills in one-of-a-kind creation of functional and non-functional objects concluding their studies by creating a portfolio of craft objects leading to employment or the launch of their own business.

The AAA and AAS degree are designed to prepare students for entry level positions in specific occupations. The AAA and AAS are not generally intended to transfer to four year colleges. Students should select all SFCC courses in consultation with an advisor. In addition, students should speak with an SFCC advisor if planning to transfer.
