Associate in Applied Science

This degree allows students to develop a degree where one does not currently exist for their particular discipline. This degree is designed to prepare the student for a specific occupation and work entry.

Associate in Arts and Associate in Science

These degrees are intended to provide the student with a broad general educational background to transfer to a 4-year college to obtain a bachelor's degree or higher.

General Studies

Creative Writing Concentration

This curriculum concentrates on the development of creative writing, editing, and publishing skills to prepare students to apply to a bachelor's degree program in creative writing, submit a manuscript for publication, or work in the publishing field.

Humanities Concentration

Provides students with the opportunity to develop a broad undergraduate background in various disciplines which traditionally comprise the humanities, including the arts, history, world languages, English and foreign literature, music and philosophy.

Culture And Gender Studies Concentration

This curriculum allows students to explore how sex, gender, ethnicity, culture and class are understood and lived in their own and other cultures and provides students the tools to critically analyze a wide range of issues.

Behavioral & Social Sciences Concentration
