SANTA FE, NM –Veterans living in the Santa Fe area are invited to learn more about health coverage and educational benefits available to them at the Santa Fe Mobile Vet Center next Monday through Wednesday, August 15-17, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. near the main entrance of Santa Fe Community College, 6401 Richards Avenue in Santa Fe. Vets who decide to attend SFCC can enroll in programs at the same time.

SFCC is sponsoring the event to assure Vets who have served the US in wars “don’t miss out on benefits they’ve earned,” said Barb Mascarenas, sponsor of SFCC’s ASCENT Club (for Veterans and their family/friends). The mobile van is operated by the Santa Fe Vet Center. Services available through the Santa Fe Mobile Vet Center during this campus visit will include:

- Referral to Educational Benefits SFCC Counselor
- Individual and group counseling for Veterans and their Families
- Family counseling for military related issues
- Bereavement counseling for families who experience an active duty death
- Military sexual trauma counseling and referral
- Substance abuse assessment and referral
- Employment assessment and referral
- VBA benefits explanation and referral
- Screening and referral for medical issues including TBI, depression, etc.
