**Supercomputer “Connects 20” Gateways Across New Mexico**

**Santa Fe, NM**— INTEL Corporation, in conjunction with the New Mexico Computing Applications Center (NMCAC), will be hosting the "New Mexico Connects 20" interconnection event, Wednesday, May 26th, from 10 to 11 a.m. The event will provide a chance to view the 3D capabilities of the gateways and NMCAC, as well as to help understand the opportunities access to the supercomputer provides in each community. Santa Fe Community College, which is one of the 20 gateways, will link to the event inside of Room 582. College staff, faculty, students and members of the public are encouraged to attend and witness the potential of the new supercomputer network.
