Material Matters: Artists Working with Kiln Glass

Glass artist, researcher and educator Ted Sawyer offers a presentation on the art and history of kiln glass forming – one of the world’s oldest known glass-working methods – from 3:30 to 5 p.m. on May 4, in Room 216 on the SFCC campus, 6401 Richards Ave. The talk is free and open to the public. Apart from his work as a glass artist, Sawyer is the director of research and education at Bullseye Glass Company in Portland, Oregon, where he has worked since 1997. Sawyer received his bachelor’s in ceramics from Lewis & Clark College in Portland, Oregon. From 1992 to 1993 he was the artist in residence at the Contemporary Crafts Museum in Portland.
