SFCC Celebrates America Recycles Day Nov. 15

Movies, exhibits part of event, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. November 15

SANTA FE, NM – One ton of plastic will greet participants of Santa Fe Community College's Recycle Day Resource Fair, to be held 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Tuesday, November 15 in the college's Main Hallway, 6401 Richards Ave. Participants can gain information from organizations about recycling and other socially progressive topics. Among participating organizations are Earth Care International, the City of Santa Fe Solid Waste Management Agency, the Sierra Club and a variety of SFCC clubs. Whole Foods will be on hand with free cloth shopping bags and Java Joe's will provide coffee.

Participants are invited to bring ceramic cups, magazines and seeds to trade and to bring used cell phones for use by victims of domestic violence to call for emergency assistance.

From noon to 1 p.m., artist and environmental educator Nancy Judd of Recycle Runway will lead a glass art workshop using recycled magazines in Jemez Room 1.

Two films will be shown during the event. *Fuel*, by biofuel advocate Josh Tickell, explores America's dependence on fossil fuels at 10 a.m. in Room 223. *The Story of Stuff*, a fact-filled look at the underside of our production and consumption patterns, will be shown every 20 minutes starting at 12:30 p.m., also in Room 223.

The event is held in conjunction with America Recycles Day, held nationally since 1997. It is the only nationally recognized day dedicated to the promotion of recycling in the United States. The City of Santa Fe Solid Waste Management Agency will provide the ton of plastic. SFCC's Green Task Force sponsors the event. For more information call SFCC organizer Janet Berry at 428-1884.
