Santa Fe Community College Youth Media Project Summer Intensive

Santa Fe, NM, June 16, 2008 – The Youth Media Project Summer Intensive is two weeks of training in radio production, audio field recording, aural expression and studio engineering for youth between the ages of 15 to 25. The course runs from July 20 to July 31, Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Santa Fe Community College, 6401 Richards Ave.

In partnership with the college's School of Liberal Arts and Core Studies, the Youth Media Project will help register participating youth into SFCC's Human Development Service Leadership Program, a course that provides students with three college credits upon completion. Tuition waivers are available for public high school students through dual credit and dual enrollment. Enrollment is limited to 20 participants.

Students who wish to continue in radio production and Web distribution can join the [Youth Media Project](#) where they will produce regular radio shows throughout the school year. To sign-up for the summer intensive, go to youthmediaproject.org or contact Judy Goldberg at (505) 986-1880.

The summer workshop's 60-hour course will include an introduction to media literacy and hands-on development in all aspects of radio production, including writing narratives, listening to radio pieces, critiquing, researching, field recording, interviewing, scriptwriting, oral delivery, dramatization, on-air hosting, panel discussion, studio engineering, digital editing and polishing radio pieces. Final projects will be posted on online and distributed to participating radio stations KSFR, 101.1 FM (Northern New Mexico), KUNM, 89.9 FM (Central and Northern New Mexico), and KRZA, 88.7 FM (Alamosa).

The summer intensive concludes with presentations and a celebration of student work.

The Youth Media Project trains young people in the art of communication, the practice of community involvement, and the exercise of creative and journalistic voice. YMP produces regular radio shows for KSFR, Santa Fe Public Radio, on alternating Wednesday nights from 7 to 8 p.m. Throughout the school year, YMP facilitates ongoing radio production teams, works in partnership with educators and students in classroom settings, and hosts after-school youth action teams and specialized workshops. Participants may receive stipends and high school and/or college credit for their work. YMP trains educators, develops curricula and broadcasts youth voice with students from Monte del Sol Charter School, Santa Fe High School's theater department, Santa Fe Indian School's spoken word club, Earth Care International – Youth Allies, Academy for the Classics and Technology, ENLACE/GEAR-UP, Santa Fe Public School's Student Wellness, United World College, Pojoaque Valley High School and the SFCC School of Liberal Arts and Core Studies.
