SFCC Visual Arts Gallery Features UNM Faculty Art

Santa Fe, NM, March 11 – In a display of academic esprit de corp between two of New Mexico’s higher learning institutions, Santa Fe Community College School of Arts and Design hosts an artistic exhibition showcasing the work of University of New Mexico faculty members from the Department of Art and Art History, March 26 through April 27 in the SFCC Visual Arts Gallery, on the SFCC Campus, 6401 Richards Ave., Santa Fe. The exhibition features the work of a dozen artists who currently teach undergraduate and graduate art programs at UNM. An opening reception takes place Thursday, March 26 from 5 to 7 p.m. in the Visual Arts Gallery.

The exhibition highlights a joint degree program available to students through SFCC’s School of Arts and Design and the UNM Department of Art and Art History. Since fall 2007, UNM has offered a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree on the SFCC campus. An agreement between the two institutions allows students who complete their Associate of Arts degree in Fine Arts to move smoothly into the BFA program offered by UNM.

The bachelor’s degree program utilizes the community college’s preeminent art studios and labs while providing Santa Fe-area students the opportunity to earn a bachelor’s close to home. Students with credits from other institutions may also apply for the special program. On Wednesday, April 15, UNM academic advisors will be on the SFCC campus in room 754 from 4 to 6 p.m. to meet with students and to discuss transfer and application to the UNM BFA program.

The exhibition offers a view of the diverse and accomplished artwork created by the UNM faculty: Steve Barry, Michael Cook, Elen Feinberg, Kathleen Jessie, Robin Ward, Baochi Zhang, Jason DeMarte, Patrick Manning, Jim Stone, Bill Gilbert, Yoshiko Shimano and Mary Tsiongas.
